Participants will be part of the archaeological team that is investigating the Roman site of Pulpon from day one. This is a complete immersion in all the process that field work implies. From the laws, regulations and different methods in surveying, to the techniques of an archaeological excavation.

Hard work and the excitement of finding the remains of Roman civilization will be combined with the responsibility of keeping the track of the stratigraphy and the finds; record sheets, excavation journals, photography, samples etc. Collecting, cleaning and classifying different artifacts will be part of the daily work as well as drawing structures and archaeological materials. They will be introduced in the study of roman pottery and find out how to get from inventories and storage to an exhibition in a museum.
